Successful start to Term 3

Sincere thanks to everyone in the school community for the responsible approach to our return to school since March. Thankfully, we had no confirmed case of COVID-19 in school. It is very important that we remain highly vigilant in the months ahead.

Please take note of the following

- If anyone in the household is waiting on a result of a COVID test then no child in the household should return to school until a not detected / negative result is received.
- no-one should be attending school if they have any household member who has signs or symptoms of Covid-19; they should be restricting their movements until it is clear whether the household member has Covid-19 infection or not. Call your GP for advice.
- Do not send children to school if they are not feeling well or displaying one or any of the symptoms of COVID-19. Call your GP for advice.
- Any child who has been tested for COVID-19 and receives a "Not Detected" result should remain out of school for two days from the date of that result.
- Children should not attend school if they are close contacts of a <u>confirmed case</u> of COVID-19
- Drop children off at school and collect children promptly. There should be absolutely no congregating at the school gates.
- We ask all parents and guardians to wear face masks when dropping children off in the morning and collecting children in the evenings.
- Many children are walking to school. Please ensure that you have spoken to them about "Stranger Danger" and how they should react if they are approached by someone they don't know.
































Scoil Íde Pollinator Plan

To make a seed, plants have to move pollen from one flower to another flower of the same type. This movement of pollen is called pollination. Without it, there would be no seeds, and without seeds, there would be no plants. This matters to us because plants provide a large part of our diet, as well as other resources we depend upon. It matters not only to humans — wild plants also provide food and shelter to most of our wildlife (birds, mammals, and insects). We also shouldn't forget that it is those wild plants that make our island a colourful and attractive place to live.

In Ireland, some plants are pollinated by the wind, but most are pollinated by insects, including bees, hoverflies, butterflies, moths, beetles, wasps and ants. Most insect pollination is carried out by bees. We have one type (species) of managed honeybee and 98 different wild bees.

If we want to protect pollination, we need healthy honeybees, but we also need to have lots of wild bees as well as other insects.

Just like us, pollinators need food and a safe place to live. The main reason they are in trouble is hunger — our landscape, from farms to parks, schools and gardens - no longer provides enough food. Often this is because we cut, mow and spray so that the landscape looks neat and tidy to us. We've been doing this for so long that we think this is how the landscape should look, but un-



fortunately it means we are squeezing nature out. This means we will lose the important services nature provides, such as pollination. We have identified core areas on the school grounds that we will let grow naturally over the coming weeks and months.

We held our annual Student Council Colour Day on Friday March 26th. Children left their uniforms at home that day to dress in clothes of their own choice. We asked that they bring in €2 for this privilege. We raised a superb €1400. This money will then go towards the prize fund for the Student Council Charity Speeches Competition 2021.
