FINANCIAL PLANNING

In order to give parents an idea of the extra costs associated with school that arise during the year, we have outlined some of them below to allow you to plan.

September: All classes: Classroom Supplies: costs of class printing, some school books, novels, Art & Craft materials, stationery etc.: €60. This is the only source teachers have for purchasing these materials so it is important that all contribute.

Personal Accident Insurance €10 (Voluntary): Highly recommended to all parents. 24 hour/365 day accident insurance. Mid-September. **Should be viewed as a necessity.**

October: Maintenance Fund: Voluntary Contribution: €100—1 child; €150 family— or what you can afford. This enables the school to keep ICT up to date, purchase all our Literacy Lift Off Books and implement additional programmes such as Violin & Recorder teaching, our STEM activities etc which add so much to the children's education.

Swimming: 5th Class Sep-Nov: 4th Class Jan-Mar; 6th Class May-June

€40 approx. Payable around the time the class goes swimming.

March/April: Fundraising Raffle

May/June: School Tours: Varies depending on activity.

All payments of €10 or over must be made electronically - it's safer in terms of banking and better not to have children carry what are sometimes fairly large sums of money.

BOOKLISTS

Teachers have gone to great lengths over the past number of years to minimise the book lists in each class. Through parental generosity in donating used textbooks and the use of the money within the school to purchase class sets of books, costs have been greatly reduced.

Part of the €60 classroom supplies money is used to buy sets of books which are then loaned to children for the year.
