Free schoolbooks for all primary school pupils

From September 2023, schoolbooks, workbooks, copybooks and novels for children in rec-ognised primary schools, including special schools, will be provided to every child free by their school. There is no charge to parents/guardians for this, as schools receive funding from Government to cover these costs.

Schoolbooks, workbooks and copybooks will be provided by the school. There is no need for parents to buy or rent these. There will be no fee for parents for this.

Scoil Ide will receive funding to buy these items. We will prioritise the use of the funding to cover all costs of textbooks, workbooks, copybooks and novels.

There may be a requirement for parents to buy some additional items for children to use at school. We will make this clear to parents.

All children in the class will have access to the schoolbooks, workbooks and copybooks that they need.

The schoolbooks and workbooks will be on loan to the children. They must be returned at the end of the school year, or if the child leaves the school.

It is important that books are kept in good condition so they can be re-used. Please help make sure your child/children keep the school books safe and takes care of them, so they can be used again by another child.

The Primary Curriculum Framework

The Primary Curriculum Framework was launched by the Minister on the 9th March 2023. This Framework is for all primary and special schools and will guide teachers and school leaders in their work to enhance learning, teaching and assessment for all children.

What are the key elements of the Primary Curriculum Framework?

The Framework:

□ is for all primary and special schools

□ sets the vision and principles for a redeveloped curriculum

□ introduces key competencies for children's learning

□ sets out the main features and components for the full redevelopment of the Primary School Curriculum, detailing curriculum areas and subjects; and minimum time allocations

□ introduces and expands aspects of learning including STEM Education, Modern Foreign Languages and a broader Arts Education

□ places increased emphasis on existing areas such as Physical Education and Social, Personal and Health Education (SPHE)

□ promotes greater agency and flexibility for teachers and children.

The curriculum will be split into five areas...

□ Language (updated to included Modern Foreign Languages (MFL) in stages 3 and 4 (3rd-6th classes) □ Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Education

□ Wellbeina

□ Arts Education

□ Social and Environmental Education (History and Geography)
