

St. Nicholas/St. Mary's Trocaire Project 2025.

Location: La Paz community, northeast of the departmental capital of Cobán, Alta Verapaz.

Context: The community of La Paz is made up of 83 people distributed among 25 families, predominantly of the Q'eqchi' ethnic group, with an economic profile based on the agriculture of basic grains such as maize, beans and some species of leguminous plants. This community also commercialises cardamom, which has sustained the local economy for many years and provides an indispensable resource for community and family development.

Number of Beneficiaries:

Direct: 17 children (6 male, 11 female)
Indirect: 66 people (the remaining members of the community of La Paz)
Work which needs doing and cost:

Cement grouting on the floor, as well as the improvement of the physical structure and services of the school : €2,944

Construction of the hand wash basin: €520 Renewal of furniture and equipment: €1,445

Total cost: €4907
