Standardised Tests

Parents can discuss the results with class teachers and they will be recorded in the end of year report.

Duathlon 2023

Training is well underway for the upcoming Junior Duathlon. The sixth classes have had plenty of cycling and running training sessions over the last few weeks, readying themselves for the big event.



This year's duathlon will be a cross country affair, taking place in the Bishop's Field next to the school. The children will be tasked with the challenge of a 3000m cycle followed by a 1500m run.

The Junior Duathlon date has been set for June 16th and we are all looking forward to it with great anticipation. This event is in its 9th year.

Last year we were unable to invite parents and guardians due to COVID-19 restrictions. This year we are delighted to announce that parents and guardians will be welcome to attend and support the children. Further details will be communicated by the class teachers.

Creative Schools

This project is funded by The Arts Council and aims to promote creativity and the arts in schools. In 2021, Scoil Ide was lucky enough to be chosen as a Creative School. A team of teachers was established and supported by our Creative Associate, Helen, to discuss and decide how best to use the funding in Scoil Ide. We also surveyed children and parents as part of our re-research and saw that there was a desire for more exposure to drama and theatre. We sourced a fantastic local drama facilitator, James Corr, who worked with pupils and teachers of three classes (Room 17, Keats & Kavanagh) to integrate drama across the curriculum. The children really enjoyed the experience of writing and developing their scripts. The project culminated in a wonderful performance for Junior Infant classes on Friday 26th May. The Junior Infants were thrilled to be in the audience and enjoyed the retelling of three classic fairy tales; The Three Little Pigs, Little Red Riding Hood and Cinderella. We are using the remainder of our funding to purchase stage risers for use in the hall and we hope to see many performances on that stage in the future!

Coffee morning for Parents and Guardian of children with autistic children



On May 10th we held our first coffee morning for the parents of autistic children in our school. It was a lovely chance for parents and staff to meet each other, share information and chat over a cuppa. Thanks to all the parents who attended. It was a very successful morning which led to four parents joining our Autism Focus group for 2023/24. We hope to run this coffee morning again next year. So watch this space!

This morning event was just one in a series of initiatives whereby the school community reflects on practice, identifies challenges and solutions, creates an inclusive culture and builds knowledge and understanding of autism amongst staff and students. It is our hope that as an Autism Friendly School, we will reaffirm good practice and support those wishing to foster a school culture that is inclusive of autistic students and celebrates all children in our community.

The Monster Raffle

The annual Scoil Íde Monster Raffle will take place on Friday 9th June. After the success of last year's online event, we have maintained the format used in 2021. It will continue to be run as a family draw where families wishing to enter the draw can pay €10 for one family entry, €15 for two family entries and €20 for three family entries. Money will be payable through an Aladdin text link which will be sent out by the school office. The money raised helps to pay for additional specialist teachers such as Michelle Aspell, our basketball coach and Marian Ryan, our violin teacher. We would like to thank all families for their support and we'd particularly like to thank those who donated prizes. This year's prizes include an iPad, a bike, a basketball net, a framed print, €250 euro voucher from 'Frame Cafe,' Denmark Street, Lego donated by 'Lego Shows Ireland,' and mini car valet donated by 'Thomas Street Car Valeting.' Merit Moments

This month we have decided to adjust our reward system on a trial basis. Instead of our usual ACE, Writer of the Month and Gaelgoir na Míosa we are presented five Merit Moment awards per class. The Merit Moment looks at a wider range of skills and competencies. In Scoil Íde we are interested in the development of the whole child and we do not value one skill or subject area above another. The Merit Moment allows the teachers to recognise achievement in all subject areas from PE, music and art to English, Irish and Maths.... and beyond. It also allows teachers to recognise effort and achievement beyond the curriculum as they may be awarded for kindness, respect
