Solar for Schools

On May 9th we installed 14 PV Solar panels on the roof of the Senior Building as part of the "Solar for Schools" scheme. It is a 6kw system which covers almost all of our electricity needs when the sun is shining. If there is surplus electricity, the school sells this clean electricity to the grid.

The scheme was fully funded by the Government so it is sure to have a big impact on the school's day to day running costs. It will also have long term benefits for the environment. We all know that we need to move to 100% renewable energy as soon as we can. The panels on our roof are guaranteed to silently produce clean energy for at least the next 25 years.

On our information display, our pupils can see lots of date about our electricity production, usage and export. We are already amazed at how much electricity we are generating.
