





Standardised Tests

Every class from senior infants to 6th class sit standardised tests in English and /or Mathematics by the end of May. These test results provide useful information that informs and guides planning for future teaching and learning.

There is no need for students to revise for these tests and it is important to note that as one of many forms of assessment we use in school they only provide a snapshot in time and do not accurately reflect all aspects of a pupil's learning and development.

Parents can discuss the results with class teachers and they will be recorded in the end of school year report.

Changes to our School Uniform Policy

The school uniform is a core element of the Scoil İde identity. It creates a sense of belonging with us here in the school and helps foster a strong connection between the child and the school. Three options were presented to the children, parents and guardians and members of staff and following this review of our school uniform policy, the following changes will be effective from the start of school year 2025-2026 as a result of Option 3 emerging as the preferred option.

The formal brown uniform was readily identifiable as "Scoil Íde" for decades. In our June newsletter, we will take a look down Memory Lane at the history of the brown uniform.

Option 3:

We do not use any formal brown uniform and all children wear a tracksuit uniform to school and we phase out the use of the brown uniform over the course of the new school year.

Children can wear the sports jumper or the rugby top (whichever fits better).

The rugby top is accompanied by a plain blue t-shirt.

The sports jumper is accompanied by a yellow polo shirt or yellow t shirt

The tracksuit pants will be navy in colour and should NOT be branded / or have a logo. shorts worn to school should be knee length and navy in colour. They should NOT be branded / or have a logo. Google " Knee length navy shorts for Children" and you will see options from a variety of stores both local and online

Important to note:

- -Leggings / bicycle shorts are not part of our school uniform.
- -Children may not wear hooped earrings or fake nails into school as they pose a health and safety risk.
- -Children should not wear make up into school

Results:

84% of pupils who responded from 1st to 6th class voted for Option 3.

73% of parents and guardians out of 338 respondents voted for Option 3.

87% of staff out of 54 respondents voted for Option 3.

Parent Association Uniform Swap and Drop

"The Parents' Association are pleased to announce a sustainable clothing *Drop, Swap or Just Pick Up*. They kindly ask that if you are considering dropping in uniforms that you wash all the tracksuits, yellow polo shirts, blue t shirts tracksuit pants and tracksuit jerseys. You may drop them into the boxes outside the office on June 9th and 10th between 8.30 to 9.30 and 1.30 to 3.30. Only drop off items that are in good condition and that you would be glad to receive yourself.

The swap or pick up can then take place on June 11th and 12th during the same times".

There will be two big boxes labelled *Uniform Drop* for the Monday and Tuesday. PA members will sort them on Tuesday night and bring them in on Wednesday morning in the right order (the ones in good condition). The swap can take place on a table in the hallway at reception like last year.


