










Team Hope's Christmas Shoebox Appeal.

Secondary School Common Application System

The completed Application Form, accompanied by a stamped self-addressed A4 envelope, should be submitted to the Principal at the Number 1 School of your choice.

Early submission of forms is advisable, but in any event, forms must be submitted no later than 16:00, Monday, 15th January 2024. Please indicate **11** schools to which you are applying in genuine, descending order of choice. Failure to indicate **11** choices may result in your child/ward not being offered a school place.

Please note that the responsibility for making an application rests with the parent/guardian.

The secondary school will acknowledge receipt of your application form. If you do not receive confirmation that the school has received your form it is your responsibility to contact the school directly, before the closing date.

Significant increase in RSV infections

We are currently seeing a significant increase in the RSV virus (https://www2.hse.ie/conditions/rsv/), a common winter viral infection which is of particular concern for babies.

Typical symptoms of RSV

Symptoms of viral infections, including RSV typically include:

- runny or blocked nose
- · mild fever
- · cough
- lethargy (tiredness)

Most children with viral infections, including RSV can safely be cared for at home. More information can be found at https://www2.hse.ie/conditions/colds-coughs-children/. However, in babies and young children, (particularly those under 5 years), bronchiolitis can cause more significant difficulties in breathing and feeding.
