Rest In Peace: Sr Pierre O' Connor

It is with great sadness that the school community learned of the passing of Sr Pierre O' Connor on November 4th, 2024. Sr Pierre was Scoil Íde's first principal when it opened its doors back in 1964. Scoil Íde was a Junior School at the time and remained so until 1971 when it expanded to provide for children from 2nd to 6th class.

While Sr Pierre was a proud Kerry woman, Sr Pierre had a profound effect on the social and educational fabric of Limerick City and will be known to many from her time teaching in St Mary's Girl's School in King's Island. We think of her family members and all in the Mercy Community who benefitted from her guidance and enjoyed her support and company down through the years.

Another past principal, Peter Long once said that "those who plant a tree should never expect to sit in its shade". As Scoil Ide celebrates 60 years since it first opened we should remember Sr Pierre and indeed Tom Barry and Peter Long who planted many trees, both real and educational.

Members of the Student Council attended Sr Pierre's funeral mass along with Assistant Principal Anne O' Brien, Chairperson to the Board of Management Maureen Hobbins and Principal Ray D'Arcy.

Bí Cineálta!

We want everyone at our school to feel safe and happy.

If you think that you are being bullied or someone else is being bullied, you need to tell a teacher or another adult that you trust. They will know what to do to help.



If a student tells a staff member that they think they are being bullied, we will:

- talk with the student
- ask the student what they want to happen
 work out a plan together
- talk to their parents
- > talk to the other student(s) involved
- > talk with the other student's parents

Bullying behaviour is when someone keeps being mean or hurtful to others on purpose over and over again.

Over the course of this school year, we will review the school's Anti Bullying Policy to reflect updated guidance contained within the Bí Cineálta (Be Kind) Procedures which were released in June of 2024.


These procedures provide direction and guidance to schools, in relation to measures to prevent and address bullying behaviour in schools.

They have been developed with the four key principles of Cineáltas in mind: prevention; support; oversight and community. The implementation of these procedures will build on the work already being done to ensure that all the students who attend our schools are kept safe from harm and that the wellbeing of our students is at the forefront of everything that we do.

The school community has a responsibility to prevent and address bullying behaviour. Schools should work in partnership with their patron, board of management, staff, students and their parents to implement their Bí Cineálta policy. We will be engaging with staff, parents and guardians and the children over the course of this year as we set about having our new policy ready for September of 2025 as per Departmental guidelines.

Core definition of Bullying Behaviour

Bullying is targeted behaviour, online or offline that causes harm. The harm caused can be physical, social and/or emotional in nature. Bullying behaviour is repeated over time and involves an imbalance of power in relationships between two people or groups of people in society.










We were delighted to hear the great news that past pupil Madison McGuane who was chosen as the Under-15 Girls' FAI International Player of the Year.
