

Vaccinations

The HSE's Community Healthcare team visited Scoil Íde on October 8th, 9th and 10th. They administered vaccines to Junior infants only from 09:30 on these days: Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR) and Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis and Polio (4 in 1). Our Junior Infants were brilliant over the course of the three days.

We also welcomed Noelia, Yasmine and Ciara from Lloyd's Pharmacy in Grove Island. They administered the nasal flu vaccine to nearly 200 pupils from Senior Infants to 6th Class over the same three days so Scoil Íde really was a busy vaccination station.

Child Protection Survey

Thanks to everyone who completed the *Parent / Guardian Review of Scoil Íde's Child Safeguarding Statement*. The feedback was very positive. Some parents had concerns about safety outside the school which is important but that is a health and safety issue and not a child protection issue.

Respondents were satisfied that the school is complying with it's Child Safeguarding requirements. These requirements are outlined in our Safeguarding Statement which is available on www.scoilide.ie.

As part of our going review and development of Child Protection Procedures, parents and guardians will now receive a text ten minutes after roll call is taken in class to let them know that their child is not in school on a given day.

The vast majority of respondents had no suggestions as to how the school could improve its Child Protection Procedures. It is worth noting that Scoil Íde follows all vetting procedures as outlined by St Senan's Diocesan Office and by the Department of Education and Skills. Parents and Guardians will receive a breakdown of respondents' feedback when we seek feedback for our Annual Anti Bullying Review which will take place next month

TEAM HOPE Helping vulnerable children overseas CHRISTMAS SHOEBOX APPEAL

Team Hope Christmas Shoebox Appeal is an annual campaign that delivers gifts straight into the hands of children affected by poverty.

Childhood poverty, as defined by UNICEF, is when a child is lacking in nutrition, water, shelter (including clothing), education or health care that they need to survive and thrive.

This year, 2nd and 3rd class pupils in Scoil Íde have learnt about the 'Team Hope Christmas Shoebox Appeal' and we have reflected on the fact that the shoebox gifts are the only gifts that a child experiencing poverty in different parts of the world will receive this Christmas.

Children find putting together a 'Christmas Shoebox' a very worthwhile experience - putting some of the 4w's into the shoebox - something to wash with, wear, write with, and something to give a 'wow'.
















After School Club in Scoil Íde with Brookview Childcare
